BITS AND PIECES FROM WTKCA

THE TREE IN THE SQUARE Despite all our loving thoughts and watering in the dry spells, our beloved Waggie Square tree is believed to be beyond recovery. Our thoughts are that the drainage and piping works to handle flood waters two years ago were just too much for the root system.

Your Association is opening matters with Council to get a mature replacement, and of course the debate on what type of tree is open for many a dinner discussion. Current thinking starts off with a cactus and goes up from there. The deciding factors will be potential size, and ability to handle the coastal climate. Moving the tree a few metres from the high voltage wires towards the wharf has appeal.

PROPOSED BOLLARDS AT WAGSTAFFE HALL

For the past few weeks wooden posts have defined the boundary of the hall to give users an idea of what is proposed. These will soon be replaced with attractive wooden bollards. We hope to make it possible for pedestrians to walk along the footpath, unimpeded, and we hope car owners comply with this desire.

A LETTER OR THREE Letters have been submitted concerning three more controversial developments proposed for areas adjacent to the peninsula.

Ettalong - Your committee has made a submission opposing the proposed 7 storey building in Ettalong on the grounds of it being out of character for the area and its overwhelming negative visual impact when viewed from a very wide area. This was accompanied by a photo montage of views of Ettalong from three Bouddi vantage points. The submission can be seen on WTKCA's website.

Empire Bay Substation - Claire & Martin Wild continue their herculean effort against the Energy Australia Substation proposed next to the Liberty Service Station. EA had applied to Council for modification to a covenant restricting use of the triangular block on the western side. Council recently advised WTKCA that EA have now decided to comply with the covenant, however they do not otherwise require Council's approval of the proposed development. EA will proceed to determine their own development as they are legally entitled to do. Updates?
