VALE Bill Sanders

On Friday 11 February, 40 locals turned up at Wagstaffe Hall to remember Bill Sanders. He didn't want a wake so this was an unofficial "wake". Bill was born in 1942 and was one of those who contributed to the post war changing era that has made our country great. His service to this community was outstanding in his 80 years, living here on the peninsula. Fisherman. Newspaper cuttings tell a story: at 15 years of age, he broke four NSW surf casting records; his longest was 301ft. Surf Lifesaver. He organised patrols for many years and the beach for carnivals and was a winning sweep in the Killcare surfboat. Fireman. A long time member, he was captain for four years in times when if there was a fire, you dropped what you were doing and attended. Plant operator. Working for Council, as their senior plant operator, he drove the D7 that created the fire trail from Albert Street to the headland. Some property owners objected then, but now all owners, except one, have agreed to the right-of-way that allows walkers to access the Flannel Flower Track.

Most of us know him now for his work delivering papers from Wagstaffe Store. It meant 2am starts in all types of weather. He worked with and for our beloved Keron in the store for 20 years. Quite a team. The 'girls' there said he was quite a trickster and loved April Fools' Day. He knew what was going on around the place and was ready to give a hand, often looking for lost dogs or cats.

Cigarettes caught up with him in the end. Bill died 0n 2.2.2022.

We raised our glasses and saluted Bill. He certainly was "a jolly good fellow".

President's Notes

As we move into March and newly relaxed Covid restrictions on activity, we hope that this time we don't get hit with some nasty surprise variant to snooker the relief. Again, common sense should see us riding this through with any luck, and our local businesses will all be hoping this is the way it will play out. We all look forward to the time when those more vulnerable can enjoy their activities without undue concern as well.

We indicated last month that council has plans for revamping the kids play space in Turo Park, and that they would make some illustrations available for the community to comment. The association offered to collate the myriad of comments received, which we have now done. Our main focus and concern was that community expectations for this park are met – a local park suited to family gatherings with both child play and open play based on limited facilities. Importantly we stressed that the needs of one age group should not adversely impact the usage of another age group and made some suggestions for modification of the proposed layout. At the time of writing, we have not heard back whether some or all of these ideas can be accommodated.

For those of you with spare rooms and sheds bursting with stuff seeking a new home, you will be pleased to hear that we plan to run Trash and Treasure again this year in Wagstaffe Hall on Easter Saturday, as is traditional. The format will be restricted to usable household items in good condition. No books, CDs, DVDs or records this time as we hope to run a separate event for these a little later. Also, no furniture. Garden items will be welcome, as will plants, toys etc. We will be asking for volunteers both via email and the local Facebook page. More details to come.

Finally, you may be interested to know that the latest modernisation project for facilities in Wagstaffe Hall has just been commissioned – solar power. We received a grant from the Federal Dept of Science and Industry under their "Powering Communities Program" to install solar power in community buildings. Council restricted us to using the veranda roof only, as the hall is heritage listed, but this still provides a worthwhile energy supply for the bulk of the day when the hall is in use. A great project for sustainability and cost reduction, and a really neat installation.

Finally, a sign off that doesn't need to include the words "stay safe". I know you will.
