President's Notes

We hope you receive this newsletter prior to Easter so that the delights of our traditional Trash & Treasure are not missed. This is held on Easter Saturday between 9am and 2pm, with donations received on Good Friday between 9am and 4pm. Thank you in advance (or in retrospect!) if you have donated items to the event. This event is important to the Association in providing funds to both cover our expenses and to make available for various community projects. And a huge thank-you of course to the volunteers who help make it all happen.

We are pleased to see that our advocacy on behalf of the community is having the right effect on a number of fronts while slowly progressing on others. We are finally seeing works to improve NBN speeds at least as far as the nodes, with fibre to the curb (and to premises if you want it) along a number of our streets. Work to date on our Hardys Bay Foreshore Masterplan initiative has been well received by Council and we are working with them to define a community engagement program. National Parks are still talking to us about improvements to the Half Tide Rocks track. A second round of dredging is scheduled for Ettalong Channel to keep the ferry running. Road improvements continue as a topic of concern, as does the condition of RSL Creek. There is no news yet on the approval for the telecoms tower on Wards Hill Rd, but need is still clear.

Apart from that, it's all pretty quiet! I hope you have/had a great Easter break.

Celebrating the Life of Pam Mainsbridge

The memorial for Pam held at Hardys bay Club brought together her family and oh so many friends. Her niece told the story of Pam's life and described it as 'jampacked'. Here is an added bit to tell of her life here at Hardys Bay.

Pam is the smallest girl in the photo below, taken with Turo Downes in the early thirties. That is when her mother took on the payments for the house *Leyton* after her father died. And Pam kept coming. She loved the place as a child, as a teenager and forever.



In the 1970s Pamela loved Friday nights at the old RSL (the Community Church is there now). Her loyalty to the club never wavered. She continued to come until she actually had to 'book' *Leyton* so she purchased land in Fraser Road, and built a house, an A-framed house so a



house with a very innovative design for the times, a reflection of her style. When she decided to live there permanently it meant commuting to work to the job she enjoyed very much. She was a court reporter taking evidence for transcription. Her shorthand was excellent.

In 1991

her partner, Vic, alerted her to a block of land for sale in Araluen Drive. She bought it and built a beautiful house and life with Vic. After his passing she continued to enjoy the view of the boats coming and going in Hardys Bay, visits to the club and friends. Oh so many friends. Robyn Warburton
