#### Easter at the HBCC - Talented artists work displayed

Our community has so many talented artists and lots of locals and visitors who want to see their work. Over the Easter long weekend, Hardys Bay Community Church held our eighth annual Art Exhibition and Sale. As in previous years, the quality of works on display for sale was excellent, and we received many comments appreciating the quality of the whole exhibition curated by our own Heidi Montanari. Over five hundred people came through the doors, to see the works of John Woulfe, Margaret Fortey, David Eddie, Cate Cotterell, Lyn Cotterell, Giuliano Balos, Rachel Lucas and Helen Pells. This year we made record sales, and many of the works purchased are now in local homes around our community. We also held an opening event late Saturday afternoon which over seventy guests attended, with Cathi Ogden opening the exhibition and then performing for us with Carolyn Packer on piano. We are very grateful to them for donating their time, and to several other locals who helped in various ways.

All the artists appreciated the HBCC volunteers giving their time over the weekend to welcome visitors and help with sales. It is a great event, enabling us to serve both our talented artists and our local community, which is why our Community Church exists.



#### President's Notes May 2024

With all the heavy rain just recently we have seen a repeat of river flood debris washing up on our beach front and through the bay. The beach clean up will take a little while and debris is still being pushed by the surf, making it quite dangerous. Ditto in the bay, there are dangerous logs and semi-submerged objects lapping up against the shoreline and lurking further out in the tidal flow. Ferry services have been impacted by dangerous operating conditions across the Hawkesbury and are still subject to cancellation. If you are out boating with friends or family, it will be vital to heed the local maritime warnings and keep to a safe speed in waters congested with debris. If you are able to manage, please bring any debris found near the bay shore onto the shore above high tide level. Advise council where it is, and they will collect.

NPWS have been active in Bouddi NP recently on planning initiatives under their obligations for controlled recreational access in appropriate areas. In particular they have been looking at options for the Half Tide Rocks Track, but questions of alignment and extent of the track are still to be formalised. They are doubtful of a managed trail all the way to the rock shelf, but a scenic trail at a higher level is a possibility. Their trail designers should advise their preferences by mid-year we believe.

NPWS are also trying to formalise a number of mountain bike trails on the western side of Bouddi NP to replace or upgrade the informal bike trails presently used, and to keep bikes separated from walking tracks. While many of the bike trails are unsuited to walking due to their gradient or roughness, NPWS is looking to safely separate these activities and not jeopardise quiet enjoyment of the National Park or its environmental values. Most trails under review are to the west of Scenic Rd and Hawke Head Drive, and away from sensitive areas. In particular, they have noted that no biking activity would be undertaken on the eastern (conservation) side of Bouddi NP, or in the vicinity of the Flannel Flower Track.

We all love the Bouddi NP and all it represents. Whether for walking, running, biking or simply admiring, any usage of the park needs to be planned for sensitively. If you get the opportunity, make sure you take part in any survey or feedback activity that may be planned by NPWS, and have your views heard.
