President's Notes

Now that December is upon us and the holiday season is ramping up, at least it's great to see we are having one. Barring any unfortunate change in COVID matters we would expect to see a strong buzz returning to our area for Christmas and the school holidays. It will be important to note the remaining COVID restrictions though, and to especially be mindful of the requirements our various venues might have to comply with. Let's all stick to the advice and exercise common sense as this whole thing plays out.

On Council matters, the newly appointed Administrator, Mr Dick Persson, is now firmly in the seat and spending time coming to grips with the huge range of issues and undertakings facing the whole Central Coast Council area. It is important for his work to reach conclusions and recommendations based on detailed examination and professional advice. While speculation continues around root causes going back before the council merger and through the merger itself, Mr Persson and his team have no brief to consider de-merging at this stage. Rather, their focus will be aimed at the core management matters of financial planning and control, operational services and HR more broadly. This association has written to Mr Persson with the request for inclusion of the various capital improvement works in our area in their priority lists and consideration of continuing to plan for them even if capital for delivery is constrained at the moment.

One area of council responsibility that has seemed to be dodged locally however is the obligation to maintain our water supply irrespective of capital constraints on "new" works. There is a major issue requiring the replacement of the water main in Araluen Drive between Heath Rd and the cul-de-sac at the Dog Track. The residents there have had over 20 breakages in this line in recent times, with continual digging and patching to rectify, notwithstanding the inconvenience of being without water. Apparently Council has agreed to replace about 600m of old pipeline entirely, but these works have been held up ostensibly to undertake an Aboriginal Heritage Impact Assessment and have a permit issued before works can proceed. Latest advice was that this assessment is likely to finalise in early 2021 and a permit issued by Easter. The Act is clear that such a permit is not required for works associated with existing utilities, so this Association and the Hardys Bay Residents Group have written to the Administrator very strongly on this matter requesting that works be undertaken without undue delay. We all respect and support the AHIA&P process but in this case feel that it is being mis-applied to the detriment of local residents. Common sense must prevail.

A new writers' festival will be held on the Central Coast, NSW over the June long weekend 12&13 June in 2021.

To be known as the *Words on the Waves Writers Festival*, this inaugural event will take place over the two days with a School's Program also running in the festival precinct of Umina Beach on Friday June 11.

The festival will be launched with a one-day celebration at Wagstaffe Hall on Saturday March 27, 2021, hosted by the Bouddi Society. Composed of four author sessions, the festival can reveal Tom Keneally AO, author of *Schindler's Ark* and patron of the Bouddi Foundation for the Arts, together with his daughter Meg who was co-author of the Monsarrat series, will be in attendance. More leading authors with a link to the area will be revealed closer to the date, along with the opportunity to purchase tickets.

Commenting on the upcoming event, the President of the Bouddi Society, Phil Donnelly, said: "Any kind of celebration enriches a community, but one such as this, which highlights the great benefits that literature brings to all our lives, is particularly notable. The Bouddi Society is very pleased to be part of it."


