JOHN MENTON'S GRAVESITE

A reminder as to the existence of the gravesite was brought to the attention of the members attending WTKCA's August Meeting. Interest was aroused and it was decided to clean up the area around the gravestone. Declared a floodplain it is located in the southern corner of Blythe and Stanley Streets. This piece of land belongs to Central Coast Council and is It is also the site of a beautiful forest with Swamp Mahogany, Sandpaper Figs, Lilly Pilly and Bangalow Palms.

However, there are weeds which need to be removed so we can fully appreciate the beauty of the block which we are hoping will become "John Menton Reserve".

In September a small group of volunteers began bush regeneration adjacent to the grave and work has seen the removal of lantana, two types of asparagus fern, ochna, morning glory and wandering jew. Progress has been made and the area is beginning to respond to the care but there is more to do. Central Coast Council's Bushcare and Heritage Officers are helping with the restoration.

So what is the history of John Menton's Grave?

From information provided by Charles Swancott in his book, *Brisbane Water Story:*

'In a little clump of trees about a hundred yards away from Ward's house and in a corner of the gully, there is a tiny grave bearing a headstone on which is carved the following words below a cross :- "sacred to the memory of John Menton born 1st July 1837 departed this life 1st October 1837".

It is believed that two of the Menton womenfolk while bringing a punt-load of furniture which had been unloaded from a ketch on an old Kill-

care wharf, to their home on the eastern shore, were capsized and drowned. They were buried in a grave close to the old headstone.

From The NSW Office of Environment and Heritage: While no proof can be found, the child may have been born to John Minton and his wife Mary, nee Butler, who married at St Mary's Catholic Church in Sydney in 1832. John came free to the colony, but Mary had received a sentence of 7 years and arrived in that year on 'Southworth'.

John Menton was in the district of Brisbane Water in 1836 and was in some trouble with the police.

In August 1838, a John Menton, shoemaker, was mentioned in a local court case as living down the river - a common description of Brisbane Water.

Fox Control Program in Bouddi National Park

National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) will be undertaking a fox control program in Bouddi National Park using 1080 poison buried baits.

The bait program will commence on the 11th February 2021 and continue in an ongoing manner until the 1st April 2021, over a 7 week period.

NPWS would like to spread the word to the surrounding community as part of the notification process and compliance with the Pesticide Control Order.

1080 POISON IS LETHAL TO CATS AND DOGS.

Dogs and cats are prohibited in National Parks (NPW Act1974& Regulations). Penalties apply.

Happy New Year to all!

As 2020 came to an end, Killy Cares were delighted to jointly host "Drinks by the Bay" with Hardys Bay Community Church. For once the weather gods were kind, and over 60 members of our community gathered to celebrate the end of what was a challenging year for all.

The past year has seen a number of new residents move into our beautiful area, as well as a continuing need for us as a community to support and care for each other in difficult times. With 2021 upon us, Killy Cares has a number of initiatives underway for us to get to know and support each other:

Men's Shed on its way

"Men don't talk face to face, they talk shoulder to shoulder." That's what Prof Barry Golding once said to 350 men at an Australian Men's Shed Association (AMSA) conference, and it became the Association motto. There are now over 1,050 sheds around the nation, and our community is about to add another.

The creation of sheds began as part of a National Male Health Policy in 2010, and AMSA is very supportive of our local venture. A growing group of local men have been doing the homework and our Shed is not far from being established. As a Killy Cares initiative, our Shed is in its formative stage, and will use the shed belonging to Hardys Bay Community Church, along with kitchen and other facilities of HBCC.

The next steps are to incorporate our Men's Shed, form a committee and raise some seed funding to get it up and running. It will initially open for just a few daytime hours a week.
