### **President's Notes**

We have mentioned previously that a we have a community safety information initiative under development. One of the first deliverables is a small but informative website focussed on bushfire safety, beach safety, evacuation routes, AED locations and emergency contacts. This is a public site with a simple URL: **<u>bouddi.fyi</u>** Note that there is no ".org" or anything in the URL, just ".fyi".

### Jet Ski Matters

Summer has seen a large increase in jet-ski traffic both in Brisbane Water and around to our surf beach areas. Following numerous reports, WTKCA wrote to our local member over community concerns relating to behaviour of many riders and the lack of consideration for other waterway and beach users. This included travelling at speed in proximity to the shoreline and moored vessels contrary to posted speed limits and mass occupation of small beach areas to the exclusion of family groups, all of which risked public safety.

This was escalated to the Minister of Transport and we received a response noting various actions being taken. We were advised that a personal water craft (PWC) rider is not permitted to drive in an irregular manner within 200 metres of the shoreline in these areas and that they must operate the PWC generally in a straight line. New signage has been erected clarifying the near shore 4 knot speed limit and a 20 knot Ettalong transit zone has been introduced.

A compliance campaign took place over the weekend of 27-28 February 2021. The safety blitz, which included targeted enforcement across Brisbane Water, Broken Bay and Pittwater, targeted dangerous and disruptive jet ski rider behaviours such as speeding, irregular riding, and riding too close to other waterway users, as well as excessive noise and modifications to PWC and vessels which increase noise. Various other training and enforcement initiatives were noted as being in hand.

We were advised that there is a dedicated hotline for reporting concerns about PWC and vessel driver behaviour. If members of the community witness unsafe behaviour, they should call 131 236 and provide details such as the date, time and location of the incident and vessel registration if possible. This will help Transport for NSW to identify reckless riders and hotspot times and days. The hotline is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Incidents can also be reported to the NSW Police Marine Area Command on (02) 9320 7499.

### 2021 and Beyond for Killy Cares

The Killy Cares committee has recently been assessing community needs and priorities. We all agreed that its timely for us to expand our focus beyond the initial remit of the organisation when it was first incorporated. A business plan is being developed and activities are underway or continue in some key focus areas:

### CLEAN UP AUSTRALIA DAY – PROJECT REPORT SUNDAY 7<sup>th</sup> MARCH 2021 MAITLAND BAY CENTRE

The day dawned fine and bright – good weather for cleaning up Australia. We had a number of regular collectors on duty – Dave and Helen Reid, Chris Bird. and Mike Chitty. This team was ably assisted at the Service Centre Admin. desk by Helen Clauser, Ann Chitty and Helen Morgan. These good ladies kept the tea and coffee flowing for the collectors.

We collected enough rubbish to fill two small trucks, approximately 2 tonnes in all. We collected 7 tyres, corrugated iron sheeting, approximately 12 bags of bottles and cans and roadside rubbish, ceramic garden pots, scrap iron and general timber rubbish. We also had a team collecting from the Community Church led by the Reverend Stephen Hinks. These



good people, all attendees at the Community Church, collected on the Saturday, 6th March.

The collection areas were: Wards Hill Road from top to bottom, both sides, The Scenic Road between the Maitland Bay Centre and MacMasters Beach, both sides, in the bush, along the Transmission Line Easement off Wards Hill Road, Araluen Drive between The Fire Station and the Boat Ramp at the Pretty Beach Primary School.

The main concern of collection Team Members is the lack of numbers of people collecting. We would desperately seek local residents to join our team of collectors since our Team Members are growing older. We collect from 9.00 am and generally we are ready to go home at noon. All of us are now in the over seventies bracket.

Dave Reid has a trailer and without this facility we would not have been able to collect the amount of rubbish that we did. More trailers would be most welcome.
