HAPPY BIRTHDAY BERYL— Beryl Hughes turns 98

Beryl is truly a remarkable woman. She came to Killcare as a small child so lived here for 90 years. She went to Pretty Beach School and Gosford High School. Beryl first worked as an usherette at the cinema in Woy Woy owned by Clarrie Riley of Rileys Bay. The Rileys had a farm on Rileys Island; she visited often because she was 'keeping company' with one of the Riley boys. She joined the Land Army during the war. The war meant more difficult years and struggling families without men. They had all joined the armed forces.



For many years she had a penfriend, Megan, in Wales whose family had decided to come to Australia. One sad day, she received a letter from Megan's husband, Emlyn, to say Megan had died so only Emlyn and his son David came to Australia and Beryl helped them settle. The friendship developed and Beryl married Emlyn in 1960. Together, they brought up David and two adopted boys, Michael and Gwynn.

Beryl was most famous for her work as the cleaner at Pretty Beach Public School. She worked there for thirty-eight years. The children became very fond of her and thought of her as 'Nanna'. She watched the children grow up, become adults and have children of their own. For health reasons she lives with her son at Woy Woy now but she will always love Killcare and her memories. UPDATE ON THE HARDYS BAY MEN'S SHED

The concept for Hardys Bay Men's Shed to serve the local community moved forward over 2021. We incorporated as a not-for-profit association, joined as a member of the Australian Men's Shed Association and conducted fundraising activities. Community contribution to this fundraising has been amazing and we are very thankful to the community for their support.

Plans to locate the shed at the rear of the Hardy's Bay Community Church (HBCC) are unable to proceed following notification from HBCC that they are terminating the agreement to lease a shed on the Church premises to operate the Men's Shed. We understand the reason for the HBCC decision is concern regarding the level of noise the shed would create and written objections which were submitted to Central Coast Council. We appreciate this has been a difficult decision, particularly following the considerable consultation which has been undertaken with HBCC and Council, nevertheless we respect and accept their action.

The Committee of the Hardys Bay Men's Shed are committed to finding an alternative location for establishing the Shed and are actively looking at options. If any members of the community have suggestions, we would welcome feedback - Email or Contact President Terry Wilson M 0405909070.

SUCCESSFUL CLEAN UP AUSTRALIA WEEKEND

Over the weekend 20 volunteers worked, braving the rain at times, to collect over 1 tonne of rubbish. On Saturday a group based at Hardys Bay Church cleaned up the streets adjacent to Hardys Bay/Pretty Beach, while others with a trailer spent the morning picking up large rubbish from Wards Hill Rd, Maitland Bay Drive and Killcare Heights.

Helena Brunner OAM - Paralympian Athlete by Alex Sharp



In a year when disabled athlete and tennis star, Dylan Allcott, has been made Australian of the Year, it is timely to recall that here on the Central Coast, we also have a medal-and-award-winning Paralympian athlete!

Helena Brunner OAM, a long term local of 42 years, is a Paralympian amputee swimmer, who represented Australia at the 1984 Summer Paralympics held at Long Island, New York. In the A4 class; aged 26, Helena won 5 Gold Medals, 1 Silver and 1 Bronze, winning the 100-metre freestyle, 400 metre freestyle and 100-metre backstroke and was a member of the winning 4×100 metre Freestyle relay and the 4×100 metre (backstroke 100m) Medley relay, setting 5 new Para-

lympic and World records. She won Silver for the 200- metre individual medley and Bronze in the 100 metres breaststroke. In the blue-ribbon event of the Games, Helena won the first gold for Australia, A4 class 100 metre freestyle. Helena won the most gold medals for Australia. In all, over her amputee swimming career, she held 15 out of 16 World Records, the greatest tally of any female amputee athlete.

Here is the story of her accident. In February 1978, while working for Australia Post at Vaucluse, delivering telegrams/express mail, during her college Christmas break, she had a head-on collision with a taxi in which she sustained devastating right leg trauma. She asked to save her leg. After six months in Prince of Wales Hospital, struggling to overcome her injuries and to preserve her leg, which had been crushed, she returned to Goulburn CAE on crutches to continue her General Primary teacher studies. In December 1979, almost two years later, still using crutches, she sustained acute trauma to her right leg yet again during a nightmare which saw her jump out of bed at Goulburn. Subsequently, at age 22, Helena made the difficult decision to have the leg amputated.

Prior to her 1978 accident, aged 7 - 18 years old, Helena had been a successful able bodied competitive swimmer, winning a number of State titles and competing in Nationals titles. Helena resumed competitive swimming but this time as an amputee. In 1980, with only two months of rehabilitation, she completed her GCAE course with a right leg prosthesis. Training herself, she entered NSW Amputee State swimming championships in Sydney. In her first event Helena broke the World 100 metre breaststroke record. Within two months back at GCAE, Helena represented Australia at the Pan Am Games, held in Oita, Bepu, Japan, in 1980, winning Gold Medals for freestyle, setting a new World Record, and for the Long Jump – a contest she had never trained for, and in which again, she set a new world record. In 1981 she represented Australia at the British National Games and won four Gold Medals, breaking three World records at Buckinghamshire, UK. In 1982 she competed in the FESPIC Games in Hong Kong winning 6 gold medals and breaking her six world records. In 1983 she continued her trajectory of breaking her Australian, NSW and World amputee swimming records.

At the time, Helena had won the greatest number of Gold Medals for female amputee swimming in the world. In recognition for her sporting achievements in amputee sport she received many accolades: Keys to Goulburn City, named one of the Jaycees Five outstanding Australians, Caltex Disabled Sports Woman of the Year (twice), the Keys to the City of Gosford and many more. Helena was named "Central Coast Sports Star of the Year, 1984", and has been described as "one of the best ever sporting champions the Central Coast has ever produced". In 1985, Helena was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) for Service to the Sport of Swimming. She was one of the youngest ever to receive the OAM. In awarding the Medal, Prime Minister Bob Hawke wrote to her, to convey the nation's "appreciation and respect for the time, effort, skill and spirit" Helena had dedicated "to her personal quest for excellence" and the way she had accepted her "personal challenge and its outcome".
