#### **OUR LOCAL HISTORY**

*Bouddi Stories, Bouddi Bios, Bouddi Artists,* a collection of stories produced on a CD-Rom in 2009, was an outcome of the Bouddi History Project, initiated by David Dufty and overseen by the Bouddi Society. CD-Roms are now antiquated so it only makes sense to turn the stories into eBooks and the Bouddi Society has undertaken the project.

The content of the CD-Rom is seen to be the most comprehensive history of the area and therefore the need to preserve it is mandatory.

The eBooks are to be found on the Bouddi Society's website. *Bouddi Artists* is there and now *Bouddi Stories* in 3 volumes has been added: Volume 1 Early Times, Volume 2 – Growth Volume 3 – Places and People.

#### **President's Notes**

The Wagstaffe to Killcare Community Association tries to support concerns of residents in the Bouddi suburbs in seeking improvements to services and infrastructure in our area. Residents from Araluen Drive, Pretty Beach Road and Albert Street attended the April WTKCA meeting to voice concerns in particular. The recent rains have highlighted the urgent need for improvements in road surfaces, stormwater drainage and in some cases the actual alignment of the road edges to avoid traffic pinch points, standing water and pedestrian danger. We recently supported an approach to council by the residents of Albert St reet Wagstaffe to have their road sealed and drained properly following rain scouring out fines and gravel and breaching into adjacent houses and making the road impassable. Other areas still have large pot holes or standing water along with broken and ill-defined edges causing dangerous traffic conditions and risks to pedestrian safety.

Our position overall is that this area has been under-funded by Council for many years. This is no longer solely a vacation village with little permanent occupancy. We all deserve quality basic infrastructure while retaining the informal character that gives us so much joy. We keep saying we understand the financial concerns of Council but we note the quality improvements made in informal areas such as Pearl Beach and Patonga and we urge the same attention be directed our way.

We try to speak as a unified voice in conjunction with other groups in our area, and between us will keep pushing for improvements as required. Feel free to share your concerns with us so that we can ensure our efforts are well directed.

Training has been particularly hard as the beach has been effectively closed for weeks from the end of January until the Easter weekend.

Highlights include running one of the best Nippers programs on the Coast as well as getting a large group of 12, 13 and 14 year olds through their Surf Rescue Certificates. Our new Bronze Medallion holders range from 15 to 76 years old. Social events have restarted with a well-received Blues music night on Easter Sunday. 'Sips' on Sunday afternoon is always popular with drinks on the balcony.

Now the Frigid Digits winter swimmers have formally merged with the Club, activities will continue through winter as part of the Surf Life Saving's *Silver Salties* program. The 'Frigids' will be swimming at the Putty End of the beach each Sunday starting at 9.00am from the 24<sup>th</sup> April. All welcome, just turn up and handicapped races mean anyone can win.

The Club would like to express its appreciation for the support of the community, tireless work of the Club volunteers and for the patrollers who turn up and patrol. We need more and particularly those that can patrol. The Club will launch the new 2022 season in September with a Community Day, so stay tuned.

contribution to the Fire Brigade over many years including ten as Captain and her contribution to the Community Resilience Initiative.

Michelle thanked everyone, in particular her colleagues in the Fire Brigade (referring to them as "family") for their support, and dedication to the job, sometimes in difficult circumstances,

In her acceptance, Michelle reminded the community that 'Bouddi' translates as 'Heart' and is at the heart of this community and its endeavours.
