

JUNE LONG WEEKEND EVENT— BOOK LAUNCH

The Harbour Mysteries by Helen Menzies



First event in a massive cultural June weekend in our area will be the launch on the Friday evening of The Harbour Mysteries, a collection of two historical fiction novellas.

Novella 1 is The Body in the Bridge, set on the Sydney Harbour Bridge and spanning the 1930s and the 1950s, up to the present day.

Novella 2 is The Pinchgut Paradox, set around the (soon to happen) re-opening after renovation of Fort Denison.

Both stories feature murder and mayhem, fiction that incorporates intriguing factual history – and a guest appearance by famed investigative journalist Kate McClymont.

If you can't make it to the launch, The Harbour Mysteries will be available for sale for \$20 at local outlets Wagstaffe Store and The Book Shop at Umina.

WTKCA AGM President's Report – Summary.

WTKCA held its AGM on Monday 9 May. The following is a summary of the Presidents Report covering our activities from 1 March 2021 to 28 February 2022. The full report is on our website.

Our events and activities were disrupted by COVID but now returning to normal

In particular:

- Trash & Treasure 2021 was held as a Book Bazaar which proved very successful.
- Trash & Treasure 2022 was held without books etc to give us more space, but we intend to hold a Book Bazaar as its own event later in the year, probably late October.
- Tennis at Turo Park was more popular than ever. The Association maintains a sound reserve of funds for maintenance of the court and any higher cost replacements.
- Wagstaffe Hall has regained the majority of its weekday usage through regular hirers and saw weekend hire gradually return.
- Our Australia Day breakfast event was a COVID casualty. Better luck in 2023.

The Association remains financially sound

Despite softer income we did manage to add to our reserves over the year. We have the capacity to continue funding certain future community projects and activities as we have always done.

We spent money on facilities for the community

Projects of direct benefit to the Association and the users of its facilities:

- Upgrade the AV facilities in Wagstaffe Hall with the Bouddi Society and a Federal Grant
- Provision of solar panels to Wagstaffe Hall using a Federal Grant
- Provision of internet services to Wagstaffe Hall
- Complete revamp of the Association website, including links to other local organizations

Funding for physical projects to benefit the community:

- A new shelter and BBQ in the park adjacent to Killcare Surf Club
- Repairs and improvements to the retaining wall and seating near Wagstaffe Wharf
- Clearing and beautification of John Menton Reserve in Blythe St Killcare

More recently, WTKCA has provided additional funds to Council for a perimeter pathway to the new play space in Turo Park Pretty Beach to allow for kids on scooters etc.

We are very active in support of local issues

The Association has also spent a lot of time over the last year in advocating for improved infrastructure and services in our area. There now over 20 items on our "list", some on Council, some on other authorities. A lot of these matters are moving, but slowly. We will continue to push on these and others through 2022 and make representations in a professional manner.

We work together with other community groups

These include the Bouddi Society, Killcare RFS, Killcare SLSC, Hardys Bay Residents Group, Killy Cares, HB Community Club, HB Community Church and Killcare Wagstaffe Trust. We are also an active participant in the local Community Resilience Plan covering emergency response measures.

Well done everyone and many thanks to Jill and her busy group at Laurieton who send their wraps to us.


Looking forward to, hopefully, a "normal" year.
