



President's Notes

Firstly an issue we'd prefer didn't need to be addressed. You may have seen quite a bit of chat on the local Buy/Swap/Sell Facebook page regarding aggressive behaviour by a couple of large unrestrained dogs at Killcare/Putty Beach. This has been reported off and on over a couple of years now and seems to have re-occurred recently. Apart from the obvious safety concerns this raises, the most disappointing aspect is the residual fear held by several locals who now no longer feel safe to walk on the beach or to take their own dogs to the off-leash area.. Credit must go to the administrators of our local Facebook page who have assembled a list of incidents to submit to Council and to the Police in support of individual complaints made by people affected directly. We all hope that action may be taken on the owners who clearly have no regard for control of their dogs or their effect on others. The beach is there for us all to enjoy, including well-behaved dogs in their permitted area.

Still at the beach but on a much more positive note, you may have noticed the new picnic tables adjacent to the BBQ shelter in the parkland between the surf club and the carpark. These were funded through WTKCA and installed by Council as replacements for the old tables whose condition had long passed their use-by date. They are on concrete hardstand and provision is made for wheelchair accessibility directly to the table on one side. Once the new grass is established this should prove a popular spot, especially once the trees grow to provide more shade in summer.

Council has recently completed its work in building the new play-space at Turo Park. The grassed areas have been re-laid including a new large area where the old pirate ship was removed. The positioning of the soccer net will also be adjusted a bit to give the most space possible for goal shooting practice. The pathways around the play-space were funded by WTKCA for smaller kids to ride scooters etc. Council constructed the play space itself with Grant funds they received for a wider program of playground renewal across the LGA.

On other Council service matters, their pothole repair program seems to be on repeat. Apart from a couple of major re-sheet patches on Wagstaffe Ave, the remainder of the pothole collection seems only to attract a painted circle and a couple of shovels-worth of bitumen

lasting only days. We desperately need a road surface upgrade particularly on the main access roads – The Scenic Road, Araluen Drive, Heath Road, Pretty Beach Road etc where no formal drainage is provided. WTKCA has made direct approaches to Council in relation to this problem, as have numerous residents. We recognize the scale of the problem across the LGA, but we need to keep urging.

In closing, a reminder that the next WTKCA Community Meeting will be held on Monday July 11, 7:30pm in Wagstaffe Hall. We hope to confirm a guest speaker from NPWS who will give us some insight into the major improvements being made in Bouddi National Park and how their Plan of Management is bearing up. It promises to be really informative. Please join us.

PLEASE KEEP PET CATS INDOORS

The study published in the journal, *Wildlife Research* and reported by *The Guardian*, tells us research funded by the Australian government's National Environmental Science Program reviewed data from more than 60 studies of domestic cats. It was found that Australia's 3.7million domestic cats wreak environmental havoc. Domestic cats are killing an estimated 230million native Australian birds, reptiles and mammals every year. Cats are natural hunters, making them more active at night time.

Owners of domestic cats need to make sure their pet cats are contained: kept indoors or in pet runs if outdoors.

Local resident, Cathie Cross, has brought the issue close to home.

Hi... just wondering if it is worth a gentle reminder to new residents that Spring is around the corner and we border a national park, Bouddi National Park. There are currently cats hunting in Wagstaffe Avenue at night setting off the Plovers (and driving people nuts). People might not know but Plovers are protected, and cats in this neck of the woods need to be kept inside at night. For the same reason people might need to be reminded to keep dogs on leads. Also the foxes which killed four families' chickens (as well as bandicoots and parrots) in the past year will be back in August. Just a thought—people with small pets might be grateful for the information.

DID YOU KNOW?

Not many realise that at the tennis court toilets there is a disabled toilet in perfect condition. It is in the block with the other toilets at the tennis court, but on the other side of the tennis shed.
