President's Notes April 2023

By the time this edition is on the streets the State Election will be done and dusted. We were pleased to hear from the candidates of the 3 major parties at Wagstaffe Hall early in the campaign, with over 60 locals plus a few ring-ins in attendance to both listen and engage in Q&A. As always, it is good to see the whites of the eyes, as they say. I think we all appreciated the opportunity to hear their respective positions on things seen as important in the community. This Association is non-political, so we will be pleased to work with our elected member of State Parliament to progress the interests of the community.

In mid March the Bouddi Society hosted the Words at Wagstaffe day in Wagstaffe Hall with stimulating speakers and discussion on the theme of "From the Frontline". This was an exceptional event relating remarkable tales and thanks go to the speakers and to the wider Words on the Waves Festival organisers who arranged for them to join us. Well done to all.

Last month we noted some priority actions we would like to see to improve our local infrastructure. Despite various "not a priority at present" responses from council and others, WTKCA and a number of individuals in our community have been hammering the case and will continue to do so. We look forward soon to taking the CCC Administrator on site through our concerns particularly over Araluen Drive traffic and parking impediments, pedestrian safety and parkland degradation.

Over the next few months, WTKCA would like to progress various ideas with the community for an outline Masterplan for the entire Hardys Bay foreshore. CCC have said that one was prepared 15 years ago but community agreement could not be achieved. I do not know the detail, but you clearly cannot have improvement if you cannot accept recommendations. It just needs to be appropriate, and maybe there were some aspects that were not "right". This community pays a fortune in rates and we have had our infrastructure ignored for too long. We'd like to hear your thoughts on what might be needed.

Traffic turning issues at the Empire Bay Drive intersection with Wards Hill Rd are also being progressed. Improvements would require a combined State and Council project and our interests are to get it on their priority list. We believe that Dr Gordon Reid (our Federal Member) is adding weight to our concerns thanks to various representations that his office has received, so we look forward to whatever added traction may be achieved. It does not require a death to get attention.

I hope you agree.


