FRIGID DIGITS SUCCESS

During September of each year, the Australian Winter Swimming Association holds its it annual championships hosted by one of the 21 member clubs association. of Sunday 17 September this year, the Dee Why Ice Picks Winter Swimming hosted this annual event at Warringah the Aquatic Centre at Frenches Forest. Seven hundred swimmers ranging in age from 20 to 95 years representing Winter Swimming Clubs from the Sydney metropolitan area, Central Coast, North Coast, South Coast and Western Australia attended the event.

One of the smallest teams to participate was the Killcare Surf Club Frigid Digits Winter Swimming Club. Unlike



most winter swimming clubs which swim in ocean pools, the Frigid Digits swim in the ocean during the winter season at Putty Beach at the eastern end of Killcare Beach.

While unable to compete to the same standard as the more well established clubs such as the Bondi Icebergs, Killcare Frigid Digits managed to secure a 1st place (Paula Dryden) and 3rd place (Sue Purcell) in the women's over 75 age group with Paula breaking the existing national record for the event. In the Women's over 65 age group, JoAnne Edwards came second. Our swimmers are in the photo above.

To cap off the event, Killcare Frigid Digits achieved first place in the 10 person timed relay. In this event, 37 teams each nominate the time they expect to take to complete the relay so each swimmer has to be able to swim as close to their own times.

What a fantastic effort for such a relatively small club from the Central Coast and a great effort by Sue Purcell who organised and motivated the swimmers to achieve this result. Winter Swimmers



President's Notes November 2023

It was good to see the Palm Beach ferry resume services to Wagstaffe in late October, despite a weather related glitch on day 2. The new timetable was agreed after various approaches from WTKCA requesting more services from Ettalong back to Wagstaffe as a convenience for passengers wanting to shop or go to the movies etc, then come back. Or equally those from Ettalong wanting to come over for a bush walk or a picnic etc. The interim shuttle ferry service actually showed how popular this would be, especially on weekends. The ferry alternates its first stop Wagstaffe or Ettalong when coming from Palm Beach and vice versa. The new timetable is published on the Fantasea website and on the various travel apps, as well as being displayed at Wagstaffe Wharf. The dredging program seems to have been done to a budget not to a finished product. There will still need to be various trimming of the sand shoals around the corners and especially off Ettalong Wharf. We understand this is being planned as part of a longer term funding commitment to keep the channel navigable.

On local matters WTKCA have recently funded the new basketball and netball practice area at Turo Park. A larger concrete pad was installed prior to the hoop and backboard for basketball so that users could move and shoot more realistically. Council were very supportive once they worked out who would pay for it. Great to see lots of use already.

WTKCA held the annual Book Fair at Wagstaffe Hall in mid October. This year we received a great number of donations of excellent books in good condition. There were the usual rejects which we dealt with but in all we sold maybe 30% of what was displayed. Our \$\$ return was adequate but the volume sold seemed lower than previous years. You'll be pleased to know that all the unsold books were taken to charity, and well received. We will re-think the timing and format for next year, but will keep the Book Fair as a distinct event. The many volunteers did a great job and we thank them for their sterling effort.

Finally, it is great to see the level of mutual support shown between the various organisations in our area. This is especially evident when the opportunity for grant funding comes up, whether Federal, State or Council. We are all prepared to offer letters of support where appropriate, and advice where helpful. Wish us luck in the latest round of the NSW Community Building Partnership Program where various proposals to benefit the community have been lodged. We've all had a level of success in grant programs in the past and it is important that we keep it up. We just need Grant Whisperers to help
