President's Notes March 2024

By the time you read this the Clean Up Australia Day event most likely will be past. This is run by local volunteers seeking help from the community to keep our area free of trash and looking healthy. There has been a focus on three areas this year: 1) Killcare Hts thoroughfares (Wards Hill Rd, Maitland Bay Dr and Scenic Rd), 2) Killcare Beach (Beach Rd, carparks, bushland, dunes etc), and 3) Araluen Foreshore, Hardys Bay (RSL Creek, mangrove areas, reedy foreshore etc). I trust good volunteer numbers attended each of these work parties – gloves and gear were handed out, collection bags etc, while council was to pick up all the bags later. As you probably know this is part of a national event and is a really positive contribution to a healthy environment.

Next time you are at Wagstaffe Wharf, have a look at the newly restored garden beds with new planting and new edging. These now offer a comfy perch to sit on while waiting for the ferry. The work was done through WTKCA as a contribution to the community and saved having to go through the hassle of asking council to remediate these collapsed and weed infested garden beds. Nothing "new" was done per se, rather a rebuild to a better standard of what was already there. By the look of the number of bodies using them, this has been an overwhelming success.


While on matters of community amenity and safety, we have been quite firm with council in the need to either repair or rebuild our prime access roads, especially Araluen Dr, Pretty Beach Rd and Wagstaffe Ave. We have had enough of random pothole patching. Proper drainage and surface alignment is imperative to prevent exactly the same issue recurring after the next rain event. Presently cars and bikes are dodging all over the place and pedestrians need a lottery ticket to walk in safety along these popular roadsides.

As a reminder for the end of March, Easter is early this year. The traditional WTKCA Wagstaffe Trash & Treasure sale will be held on Saturday March 30, Easter Saturday. Items can be dropped off on Friday 29 from 9am. Similar to recent years, no furniture, books, CDs, DVDs, records or artworks please, but anything else in good condition which you can carry would be most welcome. We would hope to take quality unsold items to the Salvos on Easter Monday, otherwise I'm afraid they will be in the skip. All proceeds go to WTKCA funds for community projects. As a reminder, any bikes, kids equipment or boating equipment etc left at the Wagstaffe Wharf parkland for more than one week will be added to the Trash and Treasure donations rather than sent to council cleanup. You can always buy them back at bargain rates if important to you.

The Pretty Beach Bushcare group is seeking new volunteers to join our friendly group. We maintain Araluen Reserve, fondly named The Dog Track, which runs along the water front from the Pretty Beach boat ramp to the end of Araluen Drive, Hardys Bay. This track is gradually improving but requires constant attention.

This area is such a valuable community access and is frequently used by dog walkers, joggers and bike riders but it needs a regular injection of care and attention.

The group meets every Monday along the dog track from 2:00pm to 4:00pm to pull weeds, mulch and plant native tube stock. It is a small friendly group that is part of the Central Coast Council Volunteer Landcare program. No experience is necessary and you will learn about native plants and how to identify and eradicate weeds. Any time you can give will help to rescue the native vegetation that supports the local wild life.


