# Larking Around

#### Lesley Adamski from MacMasters Beach has a surprising and wonderful story to tell of exploration and discovery. Here it is.

Mudlarking, once a way of surviving for children in Victorian times on The Thames, now a fun way to spend time out in the open, on the beautiful banks, lost in time, searching for the unexpected treasure.

A chance walk along the low tide waters edge where I found my first find; the top of a Pig Snout Case Gin bottle has led to the discovery of some amazing items found on the shoreline, having being eroded from the bank (only pieces that have already eroded and fallen onto the mud).

Amongst the items found are fragments from our earliest settlers in the bay.

All broken but treasures all the same: Clay tobacco pipes, glass beads, trade beads, 1828 farthings, 20th regiment of foot buttons, bone brass and tombac buttons, flint for flintlock pistols, lead quarter shot and full lead shot ,transfer ware, mocha ware and banded ware, stoneware and black glass bottles.

The pure excitement of not knowing what might turn up keeps the muddy chase alive.

Quite often disappointment when nothing does show up but always a good opportunity to take away the usual bag of rubbish that's floated in on the tide!

The mystery is, some of what shows up in the mud isn't typical to early Australia, maybe just Sydneytown; these things are not usually found here, so the question is why, who brought them here and what is their story?



So much more than tiny broken fragments, a whole storyline is created.

Mudlarking tells us a lot about the everyday history here in the Bay.

The real issue with Wards Hill Road though is the slippery surface on the bends themselves. Fortunately, we understand that this lower section of road will gain a new surface in the next few months.

While on the subject of roads, we believe Araluen Drive will get some love in the next 12 months also. This has issues with alignment, drainage, road surface and poorly defined shoulders, and is positively dangerous in many spots when cars are poorly parked or traffic not being mindful of the pinch points. We are trying to ensure that council will do the "right" job rather than just a re-sheet, which would leave us stranded with the same problems for years to come.

The Easter *Trash and Treasure* held at Wagstaffe Hall was a great success as usual. The items donated were of a high standard and keenly priced. We are pleased to say that the majority of donated items found new homes, and with a few exceptions those that didn't went to charity. The funds raised all contribute to the community projects that WTKCA undertakes in response to local needs. Special thanks to all the volunteers who helped with setting up, sorting, selling and clearing up. This is a great community effort, and quite a bit of fun to boot.
