Honouring the Poles at Wagstaffe

Planning has started to erect a plaque at Wagstaffe as a tribute to the work of the carvers whose creativity produced the poles adjacent to Wagstaffe Wharf. The following story will be told on the plaque.

At the June, 2011 meeting of the Wagstaffe to Killcare Community Association, Anne Jackson, a long term resident of Wagstaffe, proposed we create some artistic poles to greet visitors and locals when they arrive at Wagstaffe. The meeting agreed to sponsor the project. Jean Scott suggested Terry Baker, local craftsman in wood carving, as the ideal driving force.



Ausgrid were approached and kindly donated used power poles, extremely hard North Coast hardwoods: Grey Ironbark and White Mahogany, which were cut in half to give 5 metre lengths. As they had baked in the sun for over thirty years, it made for slow and hard work.

The group of carvers were local volunteers who started with little or no experience but lots of enthusiasm. They learnt both individually and as a group under Terry's expert guidance.

They obtained some second-hand chisels and gouges and later some economically priced Chinese made tools and along with wooden sculptor's mallets gradually learnt the basic techniques. An interesting point in using dry hardwood is that the poles will weather and last well and the surface will eventually oxidise to a lovely grey and so fit in with the surrounding living trees. The carving project commenced on 16 June 2012 with the 3 poles which stand proudly in the Hall park. These poles were dedicated on 15 Sept 2013 in a smoking ceremony performed by Stuart McMinn (see photo). The imagery carved was chosen by the individual carvers. The Firies-themed pole followed the October 2012 fires and was completed in July 2014.

It was a long, slow, but richly rewarding process and we all learnt a lot about the techniques of carving hardwood, a lot about our own creativity and work ethic, but most of all how we worked so well as a community group, one of the most important outcomes of the whole exercise. The carvers enjoyed the work and had a lot of fun experiencing this ancient craft every Saturday. They were truly dedicated and gave their time freely.

President's Notes

In mid July, the Land and Environment Court held an open public hearing regarding the proposed telecommunications tower on the site of the council water supply tank on Wards Hill Road. Anyone who had provided a previous submission to Council on the DA for the tower was supposed to have received advice that this meeting was to occur. This did not seem to be the case, with many residents noting they had not received advice of the meeting, nor of the offer to register to speak if they wished to do so. Despite this, over 150 people attended the hearing, including legal representatives from Council and Optus as well as from the immediate neighbour, who has invested heavily in challenging the proposal.

It should be clear that everyone has the right to support or object to any proposal. The overwhelming majority of those in attendance were supporters of the proposal on the grounds of safety and general amenity, recognizing there is no viable alternative on the table after several options had been considered.

Optus has been leading the design of the solution for our difficult topography on behalf of the 3 telcos. To be clear, they have been hanging in there for our benefit as the sole investor, with black spot funding no longer available. Other telcos would be "users" of the site, making it suitable for all customers. Optus has been faced with relentless requests for more information or to refute objections or to "find another way" over more than 7 years. If they withdraw their energies, we will remain as we are with poor service and the inherent safety risks and general inconvenience that this brings.

At the time of writing, there was no public announcement as to the determinations of the Court or as to whether further action was likely. As a community, we have been crying out for better mobile coverage for over 10 years. It is disheartening to hear the grounds for objection in the face of overwhelming support being simply "there must be a better site, just not here". There is not.

Here's hoping for the Public Interest to be served, but we will see.




