President's Notes

By now we are probably all back in harness following a busy holiday period. The good news is that this seems to include our friends in Central Coast Council who have works underway with the re-building of Araluen Drive. The first stage of this is in the area of the sandstone blocks with shoulder building, new levels for drainage and a slightly raised and smoothed surface. Similar works are to follow past the marina to Stanley St, and across RSL Creek past the HB Church. One effect these works have is the requirement to move all trailers stored near the waterfront. We hope that these all get moved by the owners rather than council having to tow them away, but one way or another they should not be allowed to impede the road works. We continue to urge council to prohibit the storage of trailers (with or without boats etc) in this picturesque corner of our bay, and encourage the owners to keep them at home or in secure storage elsewhere. Not in our narrow side streets either.

WTKCA are pleased to report that we now have a battery system added to the solar array at Wagstaffe Hall. This is sized to meet the load of the equipment in the hall (aircon, kitchen etc) especially during summer evenings. This was put to the severest test for a function in early January on the 40 degree day when it was too hot to gather outdoors – resulting in about 100 people staying indoors with full aircon into the evening. Not a kW drawn from the grid.

Finally, our first Community Meeting of the year will be on February 9, 7:30pm in Wagstaffe Hall. Our guest speaker will be from Central Coast Council's waste management unit. Want to know where stuff goes and how all the recycling works? What about the Curby program and its uptake for soft plastics? This is all important stuff that we all rely on but never hear about. Come along and find out.

SIGNPOSTS TO THE PAST by Beverley Runcie

Stories of Places and Streets of Bouddi Peninsula

Beverley Runcie, resident of Killcare and author of the seriously researched book, *Signposts to the Past*, died in September 2022; her book wasn't published. Her daughter, Myf Webb of McMasters Beach, promised her mother she would publish the book and provide the people of the Bouddi Peninsula with very interesting history. Bev's granddaughter, Kalena, designed the beautifully presented cover.

Beverley tells the story of the street names and place-names of nearly every street, road, place, park, etc, etc, etc. and there are many photographs too. The information is very well referenced and very interesting. It is a book about people and places: the Indigenous people, the first settlers and what followed. There is a lot to read and a lot to discover.

As Peter Park wrote in *Bouddi News*: The publication of *Signposts to the Past* honours the remarkable life and legacy of Beverley Runcie...whose final work now belongs to the community she loved.

Following their successful launch late last year, WAGDAGs (Wagstaffe Documentary Appreciation Group) is returning in 2026 with screenings at Wagstaffe Community Hall on the last Saturday of each month [2 pm to 5 pm]. Their January screening (Sat. 31st) is the political comedy **THE MATILDA CANDIDATE** – tracking filmmaker Curtis Levy's tilt at a Senate seat in the 2007 Federal Election, whilst specifically campaigning for Waltzing Matilda to be our National Anthem. History, politics, and a healthy dose of humour, make a heady cocktail, for sure. This shall be followed on February 28th by **WOMEN OF STEEL** - a rousing Australian documentary, many years in the making, which follows a determined group of mainly migrant women in their 14-year fight for recognition, and the right to work in Wollongong's steel industry. Their struggle plays out against a background of significant societal change: the emergence of the women's movement; Australia's new anti-discrimination legislation; and the shifting role of women in the home. Women of Steel is a story of perseverance and comradeship, told with great emotion and humour, whilst offering inspiration and hope.
