President's Notes – Mike Allsop

April was a big month for Association, with the highlight being the annual Trash & Treasure event in Wagstaffe Hall over Easter. This is our major fund-raiser for the year and as usual this relied on a team of willing volunteers helping in many different ways to bring it all together. A big thank you to them all. Of course nothing would happen without the generosity of the community in donating items for sale. We are pleased to say that we sold more than half of it all on the day, while remaining quality items not finding a buyer were donated to charities. A small number of outstandingly special donations were saved for separate sale, so a special thanks to those who provided them. Then there was the skip!

The Draft Hardys Bay (+) Foreshore Masterplan was on exhibition by Council between mid March and Mid April and they are now busy collating the feedback received. During the month WTKCA organized a couple of drop-in Q&A sessions for anyone who was interested in finding out a bit more before providing their own feedback. The Working Group who put the draft plan together were quite chuffed with the positive comments people made to them at these sessions. Various edits will be made to the draft material depending on the feedback, after which the masterplan will be put to the full Council for adoption. Implementation will be in various smaller packages over time, but we will continue to encourage Council to make progressive improvements visible to the community.

Lastly regarding the mobile phone tower proposal, the Land and Environment Court had not handed down a judgement or specific orders on the matter at the time of writing. The importance of this facility has been hammered home yet again during the numerous blackouts we have experienced recently – no wifi means no contact. We are hoping for a positive result.

Notice of 1080 baiting

The NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) is conducting a ground baiting program in Bouddi National Park from Monday 20th April 2026 to Monday 11th May 2026.

The operation will use 1080 (sodium fluoroacetate) poison for the control of foxes.

The program is designed to minimise predator impacts on wildlife, especially threatened species.

Signs will be placed at entry points to the baiting location.



Domestic pets are not permitted in NPWS managed lands, which includes all national parks and nature reserves.

Domestic pets and working dogs may be affected (1080 is lethal to cats and dogs). Pets and working dogs must be restrained or muzzled in the vicinity and must not enter the baiting location. In the event of accidental poisoning seek immediate veterinary assistance.

Landlords, agents, and land managers, please provide notification of the operation to tenants, workers or visitors at properties adjoining the bait location.
